various kinds and with limited resources to police the area WPC made the decision to utilise the facility for local events and sporting groups only.



Decision Strong objection

Proposal: - Erection of a single storey modular classroom and toilet facility

Comments

Although the description states a single storey classroom, Drawing No OPP1290992/P01 is of a 2 storey cabin 7480mm high. The application is confusing and requires greater clarification. On that basis WPC does not consider that the application can be considered legally validated and should be withdrawn and resubmitted with due clarity.



The school is in the Green Belt and wholly within the Kent Downs AONB. When Grange Park School was first designed, great care was taken to produce buildings that were compatible with the AONB location. That design was aesthetically pleasing and presented a curving green-roof to the north that minimised damage to views from national footpaths along the chalk scarp. An additional benefit of green planted roofs was stated in the application to be intrinsic sound proofing, which was considered important to minimise traffic noise from the adjacent M26 motorway. An essential aspect as a specialised school for autistic children is considered an extremely sensitive noise receptor.

In contrast this proposal is intrinsically utilitarian and of poor quality design. It would not only cause significant harm to the beauty of the AONB but would detract from the pleasant design of the rest of the school buildings.

Wrotham School which is part of the campus and next door used to be composed of 'horsa huts' which were 1940's prefabricated blocks that were used as classrooms up until the noughties. It would indeed be sad to condemn future generation of pupils to be taught in badly designed huts as before.

The proposal is harmful to the openness of the green belt and there can be no special circumstances to offset this harm, given the depressing nature of this proposal that is devoid of all aesthetic ambition.

The cumulative effect of traffic caused by both schools is currently both serious and dangerous. The A227, part of the national road network, is brought to a halt twice daily due to significant queuing. Drivers who cannot avoid the queue and have other destinations can become frustrated, which may lead to erratic driving and highway safety issues. There have been accidents caused by this standing queue in the past. This is resulting in an escalating highways safety issue which has not been addressed by this application. For these reasons WPC has commissioned a report from our Highways traffic consultants which is attached as Appendix A to this report.

Taking into account the conclusions from the Highways Technical Appraisal it is wholly apparent that this application would exacerbate the already poor highways safely issues around both schools and also be contrary to AONB and Green Belt Policy. On this basis the application should be refused.

ERECTION OF A SINGLE STOREY MODULAR CLASSROOM AND TOILET FACILITY



1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 Les Henry Associates Limited have been instructed by Wrotham Parish Council to provide this Highways Technical Appraisal in respect of the planning application submitted to Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council (Reference: 23/00835/FUL dated 9th May 2023) for
- 1.2 My name is Leslie James Henry. I am an Incorporated Engineer, a Fellow of the Institute of Highway Engineers and a Member of the Chartered Institution of Highways and Transportation.
- 1.3 I have been involved in highway and traffic engineering issues for over 40 years in connection with new development and road safety schemes within both the private and public sector.
- 1.4 This Highways Technical Appraisal identifies a number of problems with the traffic and car parking associated with the dropping off and collection of children at the school, discusses the implications and draws its conclusions accordingly.

2.0 Location and Existing Highway Conditions

- 2.1 Grange Park School shares a single site access and egress arrangement with the adjacent Wrotham School that are situated on the eastern side of A227 Borough Green Road to the south of the M26 motorway.
- 2.2 The access is located approximately 120m south of the bridge over the M26 motorway with the egress located a further 90m to the south.
- 2.3 A227 Borough Green Road is a classified road and is designated as a Secondary Route within the Kent County Council's Local Transport Plan road hierarchy.
- 2.4 A227 Borough Green Road is a single carriageway 2 lane road with footways on alternate sides of the carriageway and a good level of street lighting.
- 2.5 Double yellow line "At any time" parking restrictions extend from the M26 bridge to the "SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR" road markings between the site access and egress points on the eastern side of Borough Green Road that operate between 8am and 4pm Monday to Friday across both school access/egress points on the eastern side of Borough Green Road.
- 2.6 There is a pelican pedestrian crossing approximately 15m to the south of the school access point and the associated zigzag road marking extend southwards from the crossing point for approximately 30m and northwards to meet the "SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR" road markings.
- 2.7 The southbound bus stop is positioned approximately 35m south of the site egress within a layby with a waiting restriction for all vehicles other than buses. The northbound bus stop is located approximately 50m north of the site access point with any time waiting restriction excluding buses only.
- 2.8 The statutory speed limit in front of the school site and south of the bridge over the M26 is 30mph but to the north the speed limit is 40mph.
- 2.9 Traffic surveys carried out on 6th July 2021 indicate two-way traffic flows on this section of Borough Green Road between 7.30am and 8.30am and between 4.30pm and 5.30pm as being 1345 and 1071 vehicles respectively.




3.0 Planning Application and School Details

- 3.1 Grange Park is a specialist provision for children and young people aged between 8 and 19 with an Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC).
- 3.2 The school is based on four sites, one in Stansted Village for years 5, 6 & 7 (ages 8-12), the main site at Wrotham (ages 12-19) as well as partnership sites for Key Stage 5 at Mid Kent College Gillingham and Mid Kent College Maidstone (ages 16-19).
- 3.3 Grange Park School has approximately 157 students.
- 3.4 The proposals are for the erection of a single storey modular classroom and toilet facility.
- 3.5 The site currently has 79 parking spaces including 73 car parking spaces, 2 Blue Badge Holder bays and 4 mini bus spaces.
- 3.6 The proposals would lead to a reduction of 21 car parking spaces, and I assume the number of car parking bays would therefore be reduced to 52 spaces with mini-bus and Blue Badge Holder bays remaining the same.
- 3.7 The applicant has stated that the number of parking bays required for staff and visitors is 47 and therefore there is an excess of 32 spaces for operational uses.



4.0 Vehicle Collision or Crash Record

- 4.1 An analysis of the "CRASHMAP" website has identified there were 3 vehicle collisions in the latest 3 years of data available up to the end of 2021.
- 4.2 All three collisions involved two vehicles, two each resulting in 1 slight injury and the other resulting in a serious injury.
- 4.3 A snapshot from the Crashmap website is shown below.

5.0 Highway and Safety Considerations

- 5.1 Wrotham Parish Council the police and local residents have expressed concern over traffic queuing at the northern site access/egress point back out onto the A227 Borough Green Road.
- Vehicles can often be seen queuing on the A227 from the northern site access/egress back toward the bridge over the M26 and sometimes on the bridge itself during the am and pm dropping off and collection periods respectively.
- 5.3 Vehicles also block the northbound carriageway whilst waiting to turn right into the school car parking and dropping off area.
- 5.4 Southbound vehicles heading toward Borough Green often overtake the southbound queue at the school access and risk collisions with on-coming traffic much of which is composed of heavy goods vehicles.
- 5.5 The queuing traffic seriously reduces visibility for vehicles emerging from the site's vehicle egress.
- 5.6 The on-site car parking and dropping off facilities are therefore inadequate to cope with the level of vehicular traffic associated with the dropping off and collection of pupils attending Wrotham and Grange Park schools.
- 5.7 Generally, the situation is marginally better during the morning dropping off scenario with parents, carers and taxis etc., arriving and departing over a larger timeframe.
- 5.8 However, parents and carers often arrive early in the afternoon to wait for children to be dismissed from school and because of this there are a larger number of vehicles in the vicinity of the school entrance and surrounding area.
- 5.9 My inspections during the am dropping off periods showed some parents dropping off in the unclassified section of Borough Green Road to the north, within the car parking area at Potters Mede and within the bus layby to the south of the school.
- 5.10 However, the pm collection period extends for a much longer time and over a greater distance and involves a larger number of waiting vehicles in the area.
- 5.11 A greater number of vehicles were witnessed as being parked with the unclassified section of Borough Green Road and the Potters Mede car park. In addition, the bus layby was full of vehicles, vehicles were observed in the entrance of the access to Westlands Farm, on the footway area in front of the garage site just to the north of Potters Mede and a handful of cars were parked in Wye Road and adjoining streets to the south.



- 5.12 Nonetheless, the current situation gives rise to conditions prejudicial to highway safety and is unacceptable.
- 5.13 The proposals would therefore exacerbate the current situation as there would be less car parking available for parents/carers dropping off and/or collecting children at the start and finish of the school day and drivers only alternative would be to park illegally, unsatisfactorily or in dangerous positions on the adjoining highway.



6.0 Conclusions

- 6.1 The current arrangements for dropping off and collecting children at these schools are inadequate, give rise to conditions prejudicial to highway safety and are therefore unacceptable.
- 6.2 The proposals would reduce the level of car parking available on site from 71 to 50 spaces whilst retaining 4 mini-bus spaces and 2 blue badge bays.
- 6.3 Whilst the level of car parking would be acceptable for the operation of the school the proposals would result in further congestion within the site, and additional illegal and obstructive car parking on the adjoining highway.
- 6.4 The proposals would therefore adversely affect the safe and free flow of traffic and would be likely to give rise to conditions prejudicial to highway safety.
- 6.5 Subsequently, the proposals should be refused on highway safety grounds.
